<p>Have a look at your toys, can you find a toy with numbers on? Look at the numbers carefully. Can you find numbers 1,2,3,4 and 5?</p>	<p>Can you practise drawing some patterns?</p>	<p>Play 'Follow the Leader' with your family. One person chooses some body percussion (for example, patting their knees, clapping their hand), the rest of the family has to copy them. Take it in turns to be the leader.</p>	<p>Using empty boxes and containers can you make a model?</p>
<p>Can you be a shape detective? Using a piece of paper, ask an adult to draw and cut out some 2D shapes (Square, rectangle, circle, triangle, and oval.) Hide the shapes around the house. Can you name the shapes you find?</p>	<p>Can you practise writing your name?</p>	<p>Use your voice to make sounds like a car, a dog, a ghost, a train, bubbles and water. What other sounds can you make with your voice? What sounds can you hear in your home?</p>	<p>Can you sing some nursery rhymes and songs with your family and dance along to the beat?</p>
<p>With an adult draw some 2D shapes, cut them out and then stick them to make a shape picture. Can you make a shape picture of a house? What other shape pictures can you make? What shapes have you used?</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your family. Can you colour it in and label who they are?</p>	<p>Log on to your bug club account and read some books and play some phonics games. https://www.activelearnprimary.co.uk Code - ggrk</p>	<p>Go on a scavenger hunt around your home. Can you find something smooth, something rough, something that makes a noise, something round, something yellow, something that has a smell, something that is long, something that is man made, something soft, something you can eat, and something short?</p>
<p>Practise counting to 10? Which numbers do you recognise?</p>	<p>Get some rice, put it in a baking tray and practise forming some letters in it.</p>	<p>Share a story with a grown up. What happens in the story? Who are the characters? What is your favourite part of the story and why?</p>	<p>Can you make some playdough at home using the recipe below?</p>

How to make playdough

You need:

- 2 cups plain flour (all purpose)
 - 2 tablespoons vegetable oil (baby oil and coconut oil work too)
 - 1/2 cup salt
 - 2 tablespoons cream of tartar
 - 1 to 1.5 cups boiling water (adding in increments until it feels just right)
 - gel food colouring (optional)
 - few drops glycerine (my secret ingredient for stretch and shine)
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- Mix the flour, salt, cream of tartar and oil in a large mixing bowl
 - Add food colouring TO the boiling water then into the dry ingredients
 - Stir continuously until it becomes a sticky, combined dough
 - Add the glycerine (optional)
 - Allow it to cool down then take it out of the bowl and knead it vigorously for a couple of minutes until all of the stickiness has gone. * This is the most important part of the process, so keep at it until it's the perfect consistency!*
 - If it remains a little sticky then add a touch more flour until just right.
